Welcome FROM THE CHAIRMAN

More than six decades ago, the legendary TJ Smith really put mid-year racing in Brisbane on the radar for interstate trainers.

TJ's first big race winter winner was Apple Bay in the 1955 Doomben 10,000. The champion trainer instantly appreciated the benefits of bringing horses north to race over the May-June period.

In the following year, Redcraze won the O'Shea Stakes-Brisbane Cup double. And away it went, as each successive year TJ landed in Brisbane, mostly with his better performed horses.

As a two-year-old, TJ's champion Tulloch was successful in the Eagle Farm Sires' Produce Stakes in 1957 and four years later he magnificently won the Brisbane Cup under 62.5kg at his final race start.

Many trainers have since followed the TJ Smith blueprint to bring horses for Stradbroke Season, notably names like Geoff Murphy (Surround), Tommy Hughes (Rajah Sahib) and Bart Cummings (Dane Ripper). More recently each year we have welcomed big name trainers such as Chris Waller, Peter and Paul Snowden and the Ciaran Maher-David Eustace partnership.

Horses that spend time in the warmer mid-year climate in south-east Queensland invariably perform well at the spring meetings in Sydney and Melbourne. No reason why it won't pan out that way during The Star Stradbroke Season 2023.

The interstate and also Kiwi contingent can expect sharp opposition from our Queensland-based trainers and riders who performed so splendidly last year.

The "carrot" is not just Brisbane's balmy weather. Prizemoney is the greatest lure and Racing Queensland has backed The Star Stradbroke Season strongly with big stakes lifted across the board.

Particularly pleasing is the doubling of prizemoney to \$3 million for The Star Stradbroke Handicap, Queensland's premier race at Eagle Farm on 10 June. The Stradbroke, first run in 1890, is now the richest open handicap sprint in Australia.

The Brisbane Racing Club Board of Directors and administration welcome Racing Queensland's investment, and the support of our new partners, The Star Entertainment Group and Ladbrokes.

The Star has had a major presence in the Brisbane landscape through Treasury Brisbane and that will evolve once the Queen's Wharf precinct becomes fully operational. I take great pride in our Club forging closer ties with the Group for Stradbroke Season. There is great synergy in both of our business models.

Since Ladbrokes came on board late last year as our official wagering partner, it has been a pleasure to work closely with their senior management. This is a partnership which will deliver for both entities, to the benefit of our Members and all racegoers.

Over the six Saturdays of The Star Stradbroke Season, starting on 29 April with SKY Racing Guineas Day, we look forward to presenting top-class racing, hospitality and social events befitting a carnival to dominate the national racing focus.

Regardless of budget, Eagle Farm and Doomben will offer hospitality for every spend.

An enhanced Grove trackside marquee will be a coveted spot at the two major Doomben meetings on 13 May (Ladbrokes Doomben 10,000 Day) and 20 May (XXXX Doomben Cup Day), while over at Eagle Farm, the "double decker" James Squire's Perch, which offers a spectacular head-on vantage spot of the horses in the home straight, is gleaming in readiness for the racing ahead.

The Star Stradbroke Season is shaping up to be something truly special and I hope to see you at our tracks.

Message FROM THE CEO

What a magnificent six weeks of thoroughbred racing we have ahead of us for The Star Stradbroke Season 2023.

This is a year of records and firsts that lift our Club's premier mid-year racing event to a whole new level – record-breaking prizemoney on the line and the first Stradbroke Season with our new principal partner, The Star Entertainment Group, and our new official wagering partner Ladbrokes.

The racing prize pool across the six Saturday racedays from 29 April to 10 June is \$20 million, with a record eight races now worth \$1 million or more.

The Star Stradbroke Handicap, already Queensland's most famous race, is now its richest – worth \$3 million, double the prizemoney of last year.

The history of the Stradbroke is full of stories of Queenslanders taking on the stables from Sydney and Melbourne. It is the race all Queensland owners aspire to win and we thank Racing Queensland for acknowledging that with the prizemoney boost.

Queensland trainers, including those based at our state-of-the-art Eagle Farm infield stables and training facilities, have staked strong claims for success in the Stradbroke and all of the Group and Listed races coming up.

During last year's winter racing carnival, including Stradbroke Season, Eagle Farm-based Desleigh Forster and Robert Heathcote and the Sunshine Coast's David Vandyke scored Group 1 wins – the best local Group 1 haul since 2014. Across all black type carnival races, 23 were taken out by local trainers.

The impressive form for Eagle Farm trainers has continued through to this season, with Group 1 success for Steve O'Dea and Matt Hoysted with Uncommon James in the Oakleigh Plate in Melbourne and Group 2 wins for Heathcote (Rothfire in the McEwen Stakes Mooney Valley) and Tony Gollan (Baller in the Bobbie Lewis Quality Flemington).

With quality nominations coming in from far and wide for the packed program of elite racing ahead, we know we are in for a spectacular Stradbroke Season.

Patrons will be treated to quality trackside hospitality experiences at our Doomben and Eagle Farm Racecourses that befits the high standard of racing they'll be witnessing, including in the new Ladbrokes Lounges.

With people increasingly travelling, we expect to welcome more visitors from both around Queensland and interstate this year to sample the first-rate cuisine we offer and to soak up the fashion glamour, excitement and entertainment of each raceday.

We have long enjoyed a relationship with The Star's iconic Treasury Brisbane as our Stradbroke Season entertainment partner and are excited to build on this as the \$3.6 billion Queen's Wharf precinct is progressively opened, the first stage of which is expected later this year.

Developed by The Star and its partners in the Destination Brisbane Consortium, Queen's Wharf will house luxury Star Brisbane hotel accommodation, new cafes, restaurants and bars, retail, residential apartments and more.

Brisbane is already in the world spotlight, as host of the 2032 Olympic Games, and its reputation as a sophisticated and vibrant tourist destination will only grow as Queen's Wharf and projects like Cross River Rail come online.

The Brisbane Racing Club looks forward to being part of our city's growth, providing first-class thoroughbred racing that draws visitors now and into the future.

QUEENSLAND GUINEAS HIGHLIGHTS

The Queensland Guineas switched back to its traditional home at the very start of the carnival in 2021 and immediately produced a fitting result, which now sits neatly alongside the rich history of this race.

The Joe Pride-trained Private Eye, racing in the prominent colours of Proven Thoroughbreds, looked to be struggling at the 600m point, but under Brenton Avdulla picked up in the straight to overpower the home town hope Apache Chase.

Both first and second home would go on to Group 1 success the following season and also play key roles in the 2022 Stradbroke Season, with Apache Chase claiming the G1 Kingsford Smith Cup and Private Eye an unlucky runner-up in the G1 Stradbroke Handicap.

The previous running of the Queensland Guineas (in 2019) saw Kolding claim the prize before going on to claim the inaugural running of the Golden Eagle and become a Group 1 winner himself.

The tradition continued last year, with Guineas runner-up Dark Destroyer also going on to Group 1 glory as a four-year-old.

Quite simply, the Queensland Guineas is a race that invariably produces a star of the future.

The 10,000 is always one of Queensland's highest-rated races and the card also includes the Group 2 Spirit Of

Boom Classic for two-year-olds, and the Group 3 Rough Habit Plate, a key reference for the 27 May Ladbroke's Queensland Derby. Soak up the atmosphere and savour the fine food, wine and entertainment packages available to be enjoyed in Doomben's grandstand terraces, suites, and marquees.

DOOMBEN 10,000 HIGHLIGHTS

The Doomben 10,000 had a new chapter added to its rich history last year when it was switched to Eagle Farm, owing to the big wet in south-east Queensland during May.

Doomben was drenched in the downpour and was not able to race, forcing the switch of venue to Eagle Farm, with its state-of-the-art drainage. As it was, the rain kept coming and Eagle Farm even crept into the Heavy range during the meeting – something many thought impossible since the 2018 renovation.

Despite the wet, the race still lived up to all expectations, with Mazu justifying his inclusion in the field for The Everest with a tough win over fellow three-year-old Paulele, providing Peter Snowden with his fourth win in the race and second since entering a training partnership with his son Paul.

Mazu went on to place in The Everest, continuing the 10,000's reputation of being a great launching pad for that race since it switched back to its original distance of 1200 metres in 2017.

Runner-up Paulele etched his name onto a Group 1 honour roll later in the year when claiming Perth's Winterbottom Stakes.

DOOMBEN CUP HIGHLIGHTS

Like the 10,000, the Doomben Cup became a victim of the rain-sodden south-east last year and also had to be run at Eagle Farm after the scheduled meeting was washed out.

The Cup was able to be saved and reverted to a week later, added to the Queensland Derby and Kingsford Smith Cup card, creating a monster Triple Group 1 day at Eagle Farm.

Punters expected a put-in take-out scenario with Zaaki aiming up for repeat wins but instead, Team Snowden built further on their memorable carnival when the import Huetor arrived as a \$16 chance.

Winning jockey Kerrin McEvoy claimed the race for a third time (having been successful on Metal Bender and Our Ivanhowe) and pre-empted the success: as a special guest at the Stradbroke Season launch a number of weeks earlier, McEvoy labelled Huetor as his best hope for the carnival.

Having done bookies a favour in downing Zaaki, Huetor then did the odds-makers another favour when unplaced as favourite in The Q22 at his next start.

QUEENSLAND DERBY HIGHLIGHTS

The strong New Zealand contingent, synonymous with the Queensland carnival over a long time, had been sadly missing through the COVID years, so it was pleasing to see them back in big numbers in 2022.

Roger James had made numerous successful Queensland raids over the previous few decades and he returned last year, this time in training partnership with Robert Wellwood, with a lightly raced son of Tavistock named Pinarello.

James bided his time, resisting a run in the Rough Habit Plate to go fresh into the Queensland Derby five weeks between runs.

It proved a shrewd move, with Pinarello prevailing in a tight finish under jockey Leith Innes.

The celebrations had another element added when Innes announced post-race his immediate retirement from riding.

The Queensland Derby has more than 150 years of history, but in more recent times has been a (happy) hunting ground for Hong Kong-based buyers.

Last year's runner-up Paternal has continued his career in Hong Kong, while the likes of Werther (runner-up in the Derby) and 2016 winner Eagle Way came out of the race to emerge as super successful horses in that country.

KINGSFORD SMITH CUP HIGHLIGHTS

The Kingsford Smith Cup is the middle peg of Brisbane's Triple Crown of Group 1 sprints, run over 1300m a fortnight before the \$3 million The Star Stradbroke Handicap.

It earned its reputation at Doomben under various name changes, before becoming entrenched as the BTC Cup from 2004 until 2017, when it changed to its current name.

Notably in 2023, it becomes the eighth race during Stradbroke Season to have prizemoney of \$1 million or more, fitting in neatly between the \$1.5 million Doomben 10,000 and \$3 million Stradbroke.

Similar to the 10,000, this race has proven a hoodoo for winners heading into the Stradbroke. Thorn Park has his name on the honour roll as the horse being able to do that double, but it's proven an impossible task since.

Vega One went oh so close two years ago when second to Tofane in the Stradbroke, while Apache Chase's chances last year were cruelled after he began awkwardly and found himself in a tough spot midfield in the Stradbroke.

Still, the race has provided some of the great carnival stories in recent times: Michael Cahill's success in 2019 – 19 years on from his first win in the race; Jamie Kah's genius ride two years ago; and Desleigh Forster's unforgettable celebration last year.

Winx's name, of course, shines like a beacon on the honour roll, having claimed the race in one of the years it was held at Doomben.

But by no means is she a one-off.

The Century began with Ethereal etching her name into history as just the third mare to claim the coveted Cups double. It all began in Queensland a few months earlier when she claimed the Roses/Oaks double.

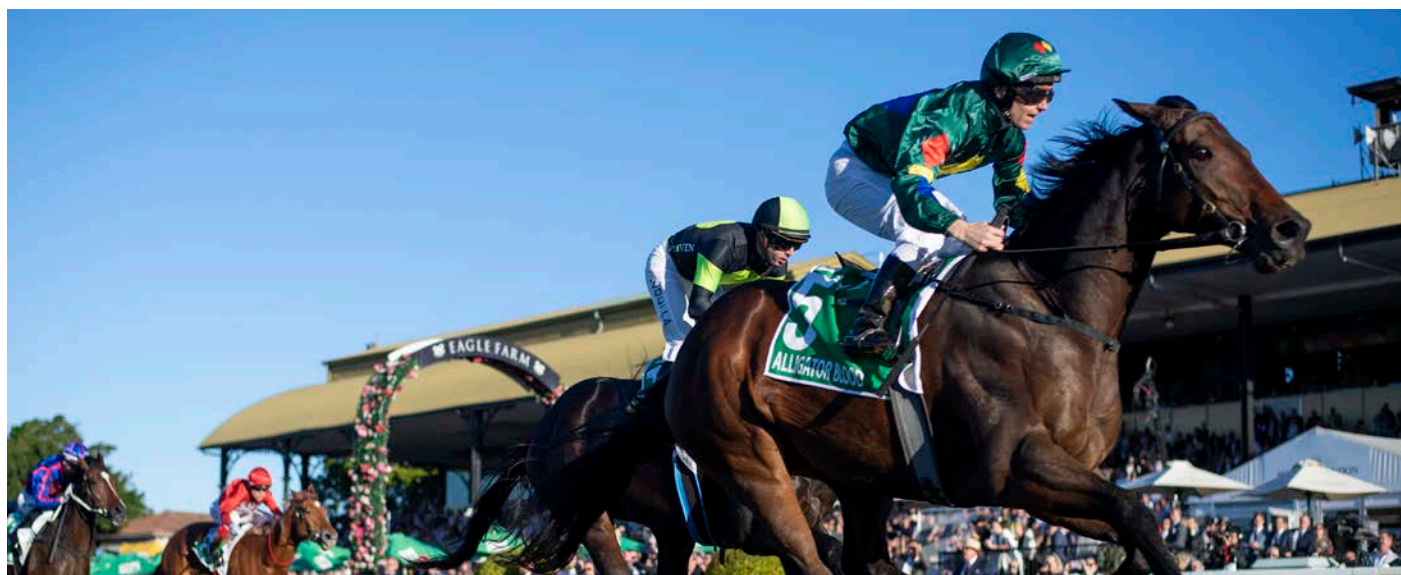
A couple of years back, Duais atoned for running second in the ATC Oaks by proving a dominant winner under Hugh Bowman, who also happened to partner Winx and with three wins, is just one short of Chris Munce as the race's leading rider.

Duais proved her Eagle Farm success no fluke when claiming the Australian Cup and Tancred Stakes at Group 1 level just under 12 months later.

The theme of running second in the ATC Oaks – like Duais and Winx – continued last year when Gypsy Goddess overcome a wide barrier to win with ease under WA superstar William Pike, thus being one of three Queensland-trained Group 1 winners during the 2022 carnival.

STRADBROKE HANDICAP HIGHLIGHTS

The Stradbroke Handicap first went to \$1 million in 1996 when Danasinga claimed the prize for the Lee Freedman stable.

In 2015 Srikandi took out the first – and only – running of the \$2 million Stradbroke.

The race dropped back to \$1.5 million the following year and has stayed at that mark, but in 2023, the Brisbane Racing Club is proud to present The Star \$3 million Stradbroke.

It will be the richest race ever run in Queensland and fitting for a race that has long been the flagship event of Queensland racing.

It sits alongside Sydney's Doncaster as one of the great handicap races on the Australian calendar, mixing the elite sprinters with top-shelf milers at a distance that tests all comers.

Rough Habit remains the iconic dual winner of the race, with his ducking and weaving 1992 success under Jim Cassidy still a mainstay on Australian racing's annual highlights reel.

But the race continues to produce outstanding winners.

Six of the past eight Stradbroke winners have gone on to further Group 1 success, highlighted most recently by the Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott-trained Alligator Blood, who has been consistently among Australia's best this season.

THE Q22 HIGHLIGHTS

The Q22 came into being in 2021 (after a COVID-enforced delay from the previous year) to become a fixture on Stradbroke day and offer a lucrative target for the middle distance weight-for-age horses at the end of the season.

The 2200 metre contest also gives the option for three-year-olds coming through the Queensland Oaks and Queensland Derby to aim up at a lucrative race against older horses to round out their season.

The boost to \$1.2 million was enough to see the runaway Doomben Cup winner Zaabi stay in training for another three weeks to claim the inaugural running under its new guise.

Zaabi was missing last year after being rolled in the Doomben Cup, but his trainer Annabel Neasham made it two on the trot when the imported Numerian stayed on best to claim the prestigious Group 2 event.

Prior to the change, the race was a key lead-up to the Brisbane Cup and known as the O'Shea Stakes.

One of the most famous runnings came in 1991 when Magnolia Hall and Spring Thaw dead-heated for first and Aquidity was only a short margin away in third. Six horses crossed the line almost together in one of the most thrilling feature race finishes ever in Australia.

J.J. ATKINS HIGHLIGHTS

The J.J. Atkins sits comfortably alongside Australia's best juvenile races, consistently unearthing stars of the future.

It has long been that way, going back to its very first running at 1600 metres in 1976, where the future Cox Plate winners Family Of Man and Surround filled the minor placings.

From there, the race continued to build in stature, every few years having a winner or placegetter who went on to future greatness.

As a \$1 million race carrying Group 1 status, it offers the later maturing babies the time and opportunity to aim up at a big juvenile race before their three-year-old season.

Chris Waller has proven a master at using the race as a springboard to future stardom, even if his runners are sometimes beaten – Zoustar and Brazen Beau being prime examples.

The trend continued from last year's running.

Sheeza Belter came across from Western Australia, joined the Peter and Paul Snowden stable and promptly took out the Group 2 Queensland Sires and Group 1 J.J. Atkins. She is since a Group 2 winner in Sydney this season.

Fourth last year was the Kiwi Sharp 'N' Smart, who has become a three-times Group 1 winner as a three-year-old this season.

BRISBANE CUP HIGHLIGHTS

With The Q22 moving to Stradbroke Day and rising in prizemoney, it enabled the Brisbane Cup to revert back to its traditional distance of 3200 metres, a trip it was run at up until 2007, when it changed to 2400 metres.

There's something majestic about 3200m racing, a challenge for horse, rider, trainer and punter.

For the horse, it's the ultimate test of stamina in Australia and for jockeys it provides the opportunity to pull off a masterstroke in race tactics.

Trainers need first to identify the right horse and then have the skill to have them fit enough to compete at the extended trip.

For punters, it's being able to convince yourself which horse will stay the 3200m best.

That proved an easy assignment a couple of years back when Knight's Order was heavily backed and totally dominant under Tim Clark, providing Gai Waterhouse with her third Brisbane Cup and second with training partner Adrian Bott.

Knight's Order had won the Winter Cup in Sydney prior to winning the Brisbane Cup and the same recipe for success was used last year by Chris Waller with Irish Sequel, who completed the same double in the space of seven days.

GLEN BOSS & THE STRADBROKE

a tale of two decades

It's 20 years since Glen Boss won the Stradbroke Handicap on an emerging star Private Steer.

The Stradbroke was the 25th Group 1 success for Boss, whose first winner at the elite level was the Chipping Norton Stakes at Warwick Farm on Telesto in February 1994.

When Boss retired from riding in November 2021, that Group 1 tally had mushroomed to 90 and placed him sixth on the list of Australian jockeys in that category.

Like all Queenslanders in racing – he was born in Caboolture and his riding origins were in Gympie – Boss held the Stradbroke as one of the major events he dreamed to win.

Private Steer came on the radar as a possible contender for winter carnival riches in Brisbane when she won the P J Bell Stakes and James HB Carr Stakes at successive starts at the back end of the Sydney autumn carnival.

Her Stradbroke rating exploded after she finished second to Bel Esprit in the Doomben 10,000 over 1350 metres at Doomben. Under the weight-for-age conditions of the 10,000, the filly carried 53.5kg for Greg Childs.

Private Steer was weighted on 48kg and Boss was selected as her jockey in the then \$1 million Stradbroke at Eagle Farm two weeks later.

"They should have changed her name to Sit And Steer when she drew the rails in the Straddie under 48kg," Boss recalled.

"That's about all I had to do. She settled in a great spot just behind the pace. When I did get her into the clear early in the straight

she just exploded. She won by more than two lengths with a bit in reserve. It was a special moment because every jockey who started out in Queensland wanted to win the Stradbroke.

"I won another two Group 1s on her later in the Doncaster and All-Aged Stakes. She was very good to me."

Most individuals who compete in elite sporting endeavours are judged on their performance at major events.

Olympic Games, World Titles, Tests, Grand Finals, State of Origin – they are some of the competitions in which athletes crave success.

Jockeys are no different.

Metropolitan premierships are highly valued but every jockey craves Group 1 victories and none more so than the Melbourne Cup.

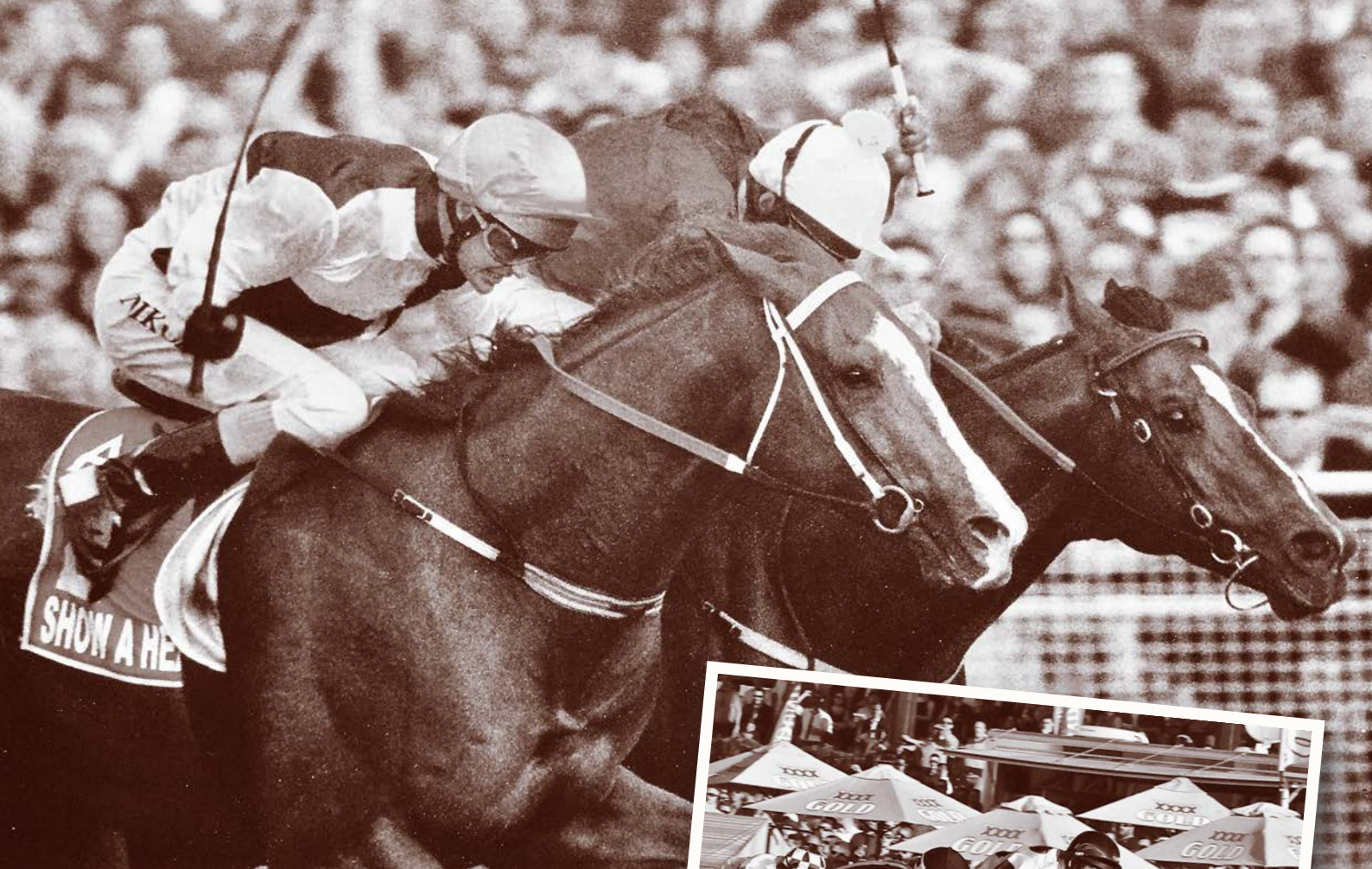
While the Straddie success was special for Brisbane Racing Club The Star Stradbroke Day Ambassador Boss, undoubtedly the Melbourne Cup three-peat on Makybe Diva is the crowning glory of his illustrious career.

Three successive wins in any major event is a mountainous goal. The Melbourne Cup is Mt Everest because it is a handicap and Makybe Diva's handicap weight went up each year and so, too, did the task facing Boss.

There was a public expectation Boss would produce an impeccable performance in Australia's most watched race three times in succession.

His Cup victories were the equivalent of winning a gold medal at three straight Olympic Games.

Rich RACE HISTORY

The Stradbroke Handicap has an illustrious 133-year history and a new chapter is being written this year, with its prizemoney doubled to \$3 million.

As The Star Stradbroke Season gets underway, this signature Queensland Group 1 race will be celebrated at a special National Trust Heritage Festival Event **The Stradbroke Habit**, to be held at Eagle Farm Racecourse on Tuesday, 9 May, from 6.30pm.

Supported by the Thoroughbred Racing History Association and Brisbane Racing Club, the event will be held in The Tote Building, which houses the Queensland Horse Racing Museum. As well as hearing colourful tales shared about the race's rich history, guests will be able to look through the Museum's showcase of associated memorabilia.

The race name has its origins in the family of British Admiral Henry John Rous, the second son of the First Earl of Stradbroke, who commanded a ship that sailed into Moreton Bay and named

Stradbroke Island after his family title. Rous was also a racehorse owner, renowned steward of the UK Jockey Club and originator of the thoroughbred racing weight-for-age scale.

Bay gelding Pyrrhus took out the first Stradbroke Handicap in 1890. The race was run over 6 furlongs and remained at the same distance until 1953 when it changed to 7 furlongs, and then in 1972 to its current distance of 1400 metres.

Over the decades, many Queensland gallopers, including Show A Heart, Daybreak Lover, La Montagna, River Lad, Spedito, Dancing Poet, Mullala, Mister Hush and Highland have bested their interstate counterparts to take home the trophy, some of them twice.

A first-class food, wine and hospitality experience is integral to a memorable day at the races and during The Star Stradbroke Season, that is exactly what the Brisbane Racing Club Culinary Team will deliver.

Led by Executive Chef John Felesina, the core BRC Culinary Team swells to about 70 chefs on the major Season racedays. The team has carefully curated culinary experiences for all six Saturdays of the event to cater for all tastes and budgets, with options ranging from delicious platters to be enjoyed on the public lawns to more-ish canape menus, generous buffets and elegant seated dining in private function spaces.

The team's food focus is always on what's seasonal, fresh, the best quality available, sustainable and where possible, locally produced, with wines matched to menus to highlight seasonal flavours.

Marquee buffets will be a culinary highlight this year – in the St Leger Lawn Marquee on the four racedays being held at Eagle Farm Racecourse and in the new-look The Grove Marquee on the
