A MESSAGE FROM THE CHAIRMAN OVER 35,000 PATRONS ATTENDED STRADBROKE SEASON

As the Brisbane Racing Club board and administration reflect on the 2021 Stradbroke Season presented by TAB, by any judgement I think most would agree the racing carnival as highly successful.

COVID-19 restrictions virtually knocked out most of the 2020 feature carnival so our comparisons are based on the 2019 figures. It makes very pleasant reading.

Wagering turnover on the five Group 1 days was up 28 percent. We had over 35,000 patrons in total and our racing broadcasts now reach over one million viewers each Saturday over the five major days through Sky Channel, Pay TV, Pubs and Clubs and digital screening.

I've mentioned earlier the significance of having a host of visiting high profile trainers, jockeys and elite racehorses at the BRC big days in Stradbroke Season presented by TAB. The highest visiting representation was on Moët & Chandon Derby Day when we had 33 trainers from outside Queensland with runners and 16 of the very best riders.

TAB Stradbroke Day was nearly the same numbers with visitors including 31 trainers and 15 jockeys.

We would like to extend a huge thank you to all our sponsors over Stradbroke Season presented by TAB. Having your celebrated corporate names associated with Eagle Farm and Doomben enhances the BRC brand.

I wish to place on record the sincere gratitude of all the BRC board to CEO Tony Partridge and his team. Many key personnel had not previously experienced a Stradbroke Season with last year's abbreviated version but they rose to the occasion.

Comments on the quality of food and beverage was highly complimentary. Well done to Executive Chef John Felesina and all his team who also serviced several non-raceday functions. Throughout the carnival, the BRC catering department had 860 staff on the books.

Over the major race meetings, the catering team served up an incredible 14,400 vegetable spring rolls, 4,900 peeled large green prawns, 6,870 peeled Noosa prawns, 3500 rounds fresh sandwiches, 4,250 French lamb cutlets, 320kg shaved leg ham... and the list goes on.

The quality of the racing was incredible. We look forward to seeing the spring deeds of Channel 7 Doomben Cup winner Zaaki and J.J. Atkins winner, Converge. Queensland now has a genuine Caulfield Cup contender in the freakish Incentivise.

Stradbroke Season presented by TAB is now over, with planning for the Spring and Summer carnivals underway.

I hope you enjoyed the presentation and hospitality of the 2021 Stradbroke Season presented by TAB and I look forward to seeing you all back at the track in the weeks ahead.

RACING NEWS | STRADBROKE SEASON

The six days of what has now become known as Stradbroke Season presented by TAB, was met enthusiastically by owners, trainers and jockeys, while punters lapped it up with record turnover.

Doomben and Eagle Farm are renowned for unearthing future stars during May and June and it seems highly likely the same will apply in 2021 after a string of superb performances.

Finding a standout was not clear-cut. Zaaki seemingly had this all to himself after the Channel 7 Doomben Cup, but the emergence of Incentivise, who won a restricted race by nine lengths on James Squire Oaks Day before another two monster wins, had pundits split on which might be the best horse for the spring.

Snapping at their heels, J.J. Atkins winner Converge is considered one of the most promising rising three-year-olds in the country and Ayrton likewise in the rising four-year-old category.

All the while, punters wanted to be a part of it, with a record \$50M+ day on Moët & Chandon Derby Day followed by a \$58M splurge on TAB Stradbroke day.

The five Group 1 days of Stradbroke Season produced turnover of \$232M, which is up more than \$50M, or 28 per cent, on the same five days from 2019.

Stradbroke Season presented by TAB kicked off on May 1 at Eagle Farm with the Group 2 Treasury Brisbane Queensland Guineas brought forward to open the carnival and the Joe Pridetrained Private Eye came from the back of the field to win. It proved to be one of the best form races of the carnival, as runner-up Apache Chase went on to claim the Fred Best Classic (Group 3) and third placed Kukeracha won the Group 1 Queensland Derby.

The next two days of Stradbroke Season presented by TAB were at Doomben, with the TAB Doomben 10,000 taken out by Joe Pride's Eduardo, before Zaaki delivered one of the best performances of the season in winning the Channel 7 Doomben Cup a week later by seven lengths for trainer Annabel Neasham.

The carnival then switched back to Eagle Farm, with Brisbane given its very own Moët & Chandon Derby Day for the first time.

Chris Waller has had a huge influence on this carnival for well over a decade and it continued with Kukeracha's Moët & Chandon Queensland Derby success. Later, Tony Gollan netted another Group 1 success when Vega One took out a thrilling TAB Kingsford Smith Cup under a daring Jamie Kah ride.

A week later a little more history was made at Eagle Farm when Edward Cummings became the latest member of the family dynasty to lead in a Group 1 winner, with Duais a standout performer in the James Squire Queensland Oaks.

It was then off to Stradbroke Season presented by TAB grand final day for the TAB Stradbroke, Treasury Brisbane J.J. Atkins and first running of the new-look SKY Racing Q22.

In each instance, we were privy to a stellar performance.



Tofane added her name to the Stradbroke honour roll in providing second wins in the race for both trainer Mike Moroney and jockey Craig Williams. She would later go on to complete the Stradbroke-Tattersall's Tiara double in now becoming a three-times Group 1 winner.



Earlier on Stradbroke Day, Gai Waterhouse and Adrian Bott combined with Tim Clark to win the J.J. Atkins with Converge.

Zaaki rounded out an unblemished Queensland carnival by taking the Q22 under James McDonald, while one-time Stradbroke favourite Ayrton franked his Spring credentials with an arrogant display to win the Group 3 Gunsynd Classic.

James McDonald just edged out Craig Williams for riding honours over Stradbroke Season presented by TAB, landing seven black type races to Williams' six.

In the training department, Chris Waller had five feature race winners, but Brisbane's Premier Trainer Tony Gollan more than held his own with four.

Headed by Gollan, the local trainers enjoyed a strong carnival. Rob Heathcote won Group races with Prince Of Boom and Emerald Kingdom, as did Steve Tregea with Incentivise and Niccanova.

Peter and Will Hulbert (Criminal Defence) and Desleigh Forster (Apache Chase) also won Group 3 events.

Chris Munce, Kelly Schweida, Steve O'Dea and Matt Hoysted and Toby and Trent Edmonds were other local trainers to win stakes races during Stradbroke Season presented by TAB.

MEMBER PROFILE CHRIS SEIDNER

Chris Seidner became a BRC Member in 2014. Racing tragic Chris Seidner spent the bulk of his working life on the road but now is enjoying a lot of Brisbane lifestyle. In recent years Seidner has become a fixture in the BRC Members' Area at both Eagle Farm and Doomben.

He and wife Maureen have purchased a home in Albany Creek but the couple still run 400 head of cattle on a 900ha property at Gayndah where Chris was born.

For 25 years Chris worked in rural insurance for WFI Insurance. "I was a self employed contractural agent for WFI for 23 of those years," he said.

"I had over 1500 clients on a very wide area which included communities like Yarraman, Kilkivan, Taree, Moonie, Tara and a lot more. I made a lot of friends and the travel didn't worry me."

Racing has been a passion for Chris from a young age. He first worked as a bookmaker's clerk for Roy Lutvey at country meetings as a teenager.

"My grandfather ran a hotel in Gayndah and as was the norm in the day there were a couple of racehorses kept in the backyard. My father came back from World War II and started penciling for a bookie so I soon became involved in racing," Chris explained.

"The first day I worked for Roy was at the Burrandowan picnic meeting and it was full on. Fortunately a couple of results fell our way."

Gayndah Jockey Club officials proudly lay claim to the running of the first Queensland Derby in 1868. The race was run again in the following two years before being transferred to Eagle Farm.

Chris joined the GJC committee over 20 years ago, became president in 2000 and held that position until standing down in 2017.

For the past few years Chris has become an active member of the Bernborough Club and last month accepted an invitation to join the committee of the club.
